- 1 COSTERMONGERS BARROW
 - 2 KNIFE GRINDING BARROW
 - 3 SHEPHERD'S HUT with a new window, roof, chimney, fireplace and bed
 - 4 TIP CART to suit approx. 17 hh; in a red wash finish with black lining, although repainting would be beneficial. The tip body is of later construction and in sound condition, as are the unders which have treated in the past, the axle by the well known company 'Kirksall Forge Co. of Leeds', this being marked on the hub caps. Also used on the Swinton Estate in North Yorkshire, as a Coal Cart
 - 5 MARKET CART by Thackwray & Musgrave of Masham circa 1895 to suit 15-2 to 17 hh; in varnished natural wood with black lining and a black leatherette seat. A sound vehicle which would benefit from some attention and has the potential to be suitable for country cart classes, having 53" 14-spoke iron shod wheels, tapered springs, and a mail axle marked 'Stansfeld, Leeds'. Used on the Swinton Castle Estate, Masham, North Yorkshire, particularly in the shooting season
 - 6 MINIATURE WAGONETTE, on metal spoked wheels, to suit a small pony; painted yellow and orange and in need of repainting. With shafts
 - 7 FOUR-WHEELED FRENCH FARMERS CART to suit 14 to 16 hh, all combinations; painted red with gold lining and red upholstery. In fair condition and fitted with brakes
 - 8 EXERCISE CART built by Myross Eng. of Hartlepool in 2000 to suit 13 hh and over, single or pair; painted black with gold lining and tan seating. In excellent condition
 - 9 FOUR-WHEELED EXERCISE CART, on pneumatics, to suit 14 to 15-2 hh; in varnished wood with black metalwork and black vinyl seating. With a footbrake and back step
 - 10 EXERCISE CART to suit 12 to 13 hh; in natural wood with black metalwork and in need of attention
 - 11 EXERCISE CART, on pneumatics, to suit 13 to 14 hh; painted red. In need of a seat and some attention
 - 12 BREAKING CART to suit 14 to 15 hh; painted red with yellow lining. With access from the rear and on wooden wheels
 - 13 MARATHON CART, English built circa 1990, to suit 14 to 15 hh; painted dark blue with white lining and brown vinyl seating. With a back step and wedge seat
 - 14 MARATHON CART by Jacks & Sons of Hay on Wye to suit 13-2 to 14 hh; painted blue, with a blue cushion. On metal wheels
 - 15 THREE-PHASE COMPETITION VEHICLE by Hartland Carriages of Horsham circa 2004 to suit a 13 to 14-2 hh pair; smartly painted dark blue with yellow lining, and upholstered in black vinyl. With delayed steering, extending axles, wedge seat, quick release cups, disc brakes and a pole

- 16 BUTCHERS CART built by Mr Betts of London in 2002 to suit 12 to 13-2 hh; recently restored and in a show finish of maroon and cream with black lining
- 17 CUT UNDER GIG by Offord of London circa 1900 to suit 14-2 to 16 hh; finished in black with gold leaf lining and varnished rosewood panels to the body, with black velour upholstery and patent dash and splashboards. An elegant show gig by a good builder on 16-spoke wheels, which has a spindled seat back, swingletree with axle chains and sprung shafts, and has been used with six different horses to qualify for the Horse of the Year Show eight times. *Illustrated on the front cover*
- 18 YORKSHIRE ICE CREAM CART to suit 14 to 14-2 hh; ornately finished and painted cream and red, and in good order. *Originally a 'Danny Oates of Brierley, South Yorkshire' cart which along with horse Tommy sold its last ice cream on 31st December 1999 in Balby, Doncaster. In August 2002 a centenary celebration was held in Brierley when the cart was used round the village to sell penny licks to raise funds for Cancer Research. The cart has also been acknowledged by the late Queen Mother who saw it in 1997*
- 19 ROUND BACK GIG by Wm. Kinross of Stirling circa 1950 to suit 15 to 15-2 hh; in an immaculate show finish of black with gold lining and buttoned beige cloth upholstery. A good quality show gig by a renowned builder which is on fine 16-spoke warner wheels and triple springs, with patent splashboards with loop handles, and sprung shaft ends
- 20 FOUR-WHEELED DOG CART by Fulkel & Sons of Salisbury circa 1905 to suit 14 to 15-2 hh, single or pair; the body painted black, on red wheels and unders lined orange, with black leather upholstery. Formerly used by the late Mary Matthews in the early days of driving trials and used by the present owner for country weddings. With two pairs of shafts, pole and splinter bar. *A pair of oval fronted lamps will be offered separately*
- 21 ROUND BACK GIG to suit 14-2 to 16 hh; recently completely renovated to a very high standard and finished in black, with wicker to the round seat back and deeply buttoned upholstery. A fine and elegant vehicle which is in top show condition and ready for the season ahead, having not been used since renovation
- 22 DELIVERY BROUGHAM, restored to show condition in 2008, to suit 14-2 to 16 hh; the body painted maroon with cream lining and writing, on black wheels and unders lined cream, the seat and roof covering in black leather. A good quality trade vehicle, with louvered side and front sections and well painted baskets of fruit and vegetables, which is fitted with chrome furniture and ready for the 2009 season
- 23 BOW FRONTED BROUGHAM by Pink & Sons of Fareham to suit 14-2 to 16 hh, single or pair; painted green with gold lining and upholstered in green, although the interior is in need of attention. With pole, shafts, splinter bar and a handbrake
- 24 DOUBLE BROUGHAM by Stuart of Newry to suit 14 to 16 hh; painted blue with gold lining and upholstered in maroon draylon. Currently being used for weddings and pub trips
- 25 SPINDLE BACK GIG by Brown & Sons of Windsor & London to suit 14-2 to 15-2 hh; in a show finish following recent renovation of black with golden yellow lining and beige cord trim. An elegant show ring gig by a leading builder, which is on 54" English pattern wheels and triple springs, with sprung trace hooks and patent dash and splash boards, with integral handles

- 26 ROUND BACK GIG by J A Lawton & Co. of London, Liverpool and Chester to suit 15 to 15-2 hh; in a show finish of black and blue, with blue and red lining and buttoned blue wool cloth upholstery. Another desirable show ring gig by a sought after builder which is on 54" 16-spoke English pattern wheels with a mail axle and triple springs, with the added features of leather backed stirrup steps, leather dash and splashboards with integral handles and sprung trace hooks. *A brass makers plaque is on the front splinter bar*
- 26A ROUND BACK GIG by Mills of Paddington to suit 13 to 13-2 hh; in a Concours finish of black with yellow wheels and shafts, with black lining. An attractive show gig by an excellent builder in a sought after size which has bucket steps, leather dash and splash boards and stamped ironwork throughout. Purchased from an auction in Scotland about five years ago and recently repainted
- 27 BROUGHAM by Smiths of Scotland to suit 13 hh and over, single or pair; painted black and maroon with yellow lining and pink upholstery. In very good condition
- 28 WAGONETTE built by Simpsons of Hartlepool in 2009 to suit 14 hh and over, single or pair; painted yellow with maroon lining and black upholstery, and in very good order
- 29 RALLI CAR built circa 1900 to suit 12-2 to 14 hh, single or tandem; in varnished natural wood, the wheels lined yellow, with beige cord upholstery. Restored by Barry Wheelwright two years ago, when the original wheels were refurbished; with a swingletree
- 30 VICTORIA, of German origin circa 1870, to suit 13-2 to 15 hh, single or pair; painted royal blue with gold lining and red vinyl upholstery. Fully restored in 2006 and unused since then
- 31 BOW TOP GYPSY WAGON to suit 15-2 hh and over; the canvas covered body painted green, with beige, red, blue and white scrolls and decoration, on yellow unders with red and green decoration, the door with a rearing horse and sunflower. The edges have been scalloped and the ribs chamfered, with good carving to the turntable. The interior is painted burgundy with multi coloured decoration, scrolls and birds, with a pull out table under the bed compartment, good mahogany cupboards, bevelled glass mirrors to the cupboard doors and a square 'Marianna' stove in blue and white surround, in working order. On iron shod wheels, with a bay window above the cratch and pan box, with varnished wood panels to the sides and older or original paintwork to the rear and sides. To be sold with steps and shafts
- 32 BURTON GYPSY WAGON, thought to be by Thomas of Chertsey circa 1926, to suit a 14 to 15-2 hh cob; the body painted burgundy with red, green and white lining and highlights to the chamfers, on yellow unders lined and scrolled in red and green. Recently fully renovated and nearly finished, the iron shod wheels being renovated by Crofords of Ashford, Kent and the woodwork updated, with new door, shutters, furniture and pan box; the door bears a rearing horse and dove and the pan box is decorated with carved horses. The chrome chimney flue and roofing material need to be fitted to complete the project. *The previous owner was Mr Tom Lee, general secretary of the Romany Guild*
- 33 BURTON GYPSY WAGON to suit 14 hh and over; the body painted red, with white and red door and shutters, the ribs and scalloped edges painted yellow, with yellow and green scrolls to the porch brackets, and fruit and foliate carvings to the front. The unders are in cream white with red chamfers to the wheels and turntable, with green lining. With a mollicroft and shafts
- 34 BOW TOP GYPSY WAGON to suit approx. 15 hh; painted green with a new canvas, on cream unders. In good order, the interior being fitted with a stove, and to be sold with shafts
- 35 PANEL GIG to suit 14 to 15 hh; the body in varnished natural wood, on dark iron shod wheels with yellow shafts.

- 36 PHAETON, of Continental origin, to suit 14 to 15 hh; painted green with light green lining and black leather upholstery. With a footbrake, shafts and detachable back seat
- 37 CUT UNDER GIG to suit 12 to 12-2 hh; painted maroon with red lining and black upholstery. A cab fronted type gig with easy access which is in good order and has been little used
- 38 VICTORIA, of recent construction, to suit 14 to 14-2 hh single or pair, having shafts and pole; smartly finished in dark blue, with yellow lining and buttoned black upholstery. Purchased from a Reading sale and used only once since then, remaining in excellent condition. With four disc brakes and a handbrake
- 39 MILK FLOAT, built circa 1900, to suit a 14 to 15 hh Dales or cob type; painted light brown and cream and lined in contrast. A smart float which is ready for the show ring
- 40 LIVERPOOL GIG to suit 14-2 to 15-2 hh; painted black and yellow and in good order
- 41 WAGONETTE to suit 15-2 hh and over, single or pair; painted dark red and black, with buttoned black leatherette upholstery. With seating for eight passengers behind, plus a pair of detachable trade boards, shafts and a pole
- 42 RALLI CAR by C Hill of Warwick circa 1900 to suit 12 to 13 hh; painted black with yellow lining and leather upholstery. *A pair of lamps will be offered separately*
- 43 PLEASURE DRIVING GIG, of recent construction on the Continent, to suit 13-2 to 14-2 hh; painted black with yellow lining and black vinyl upholstery. With disc brakes and a spares basket
- 44 GOVERNESS CAR by Millington of Cirencester to suit 12-2 hh and over; the body in varnished natural wood on red 16-spoke warner wheels, lined black, with red upholstery. Stored for the last 30 years although previously used for showing
- 45 FOUR-WHEELED DOG CART, circa 1980, to suit a pair, 15 to 15-2 hh; the body in varnished natural wood, on green wheels and unders lined yellow, with black vinyl seating. With hand and foot brakes and in need of some attention
- 46 MARKET FLOAT to suit 13 to 13-2 hh; painted green with yellow unders. An unusual and small float on a cranked axle which was recently rebuilt and fitted with new shafts and wheels
- 47 RALLI CAR, by Pettits of Bury St. Edmunds pre 1900, to suit 14-3 to 16 hh; painted dark green with yellow lining and black upholstery. In need of some touching up, having been in the same household since 1968 and shown with moderate success between 1969 and 1973
- 48 TANDEM CART by Brittain & Sons of Bristol & Birmingham to suit 14 to 15-2 hh, single or tandem; smartly painted black and green with yellow lining and beige cloth upholstery. A desirable country type vehicle with leather backed stirrup steps and louvered panels to the sides
- 49 HEARSE, of Scandinavian origin circa 1880, to suit a single or pair, having shafts and pole; in good, sound condition but in need of refurbishment to restore to its former glory. To be sold with a set of sleigh runners so it can be converted for use in the snow
- 50 PHAETON, built circa 1880, to suit 14 hh and over, single or pair; finished in varnished natural wood with buttoned brown leather upholstery. A lightweight vehicle which could be used for weddings, on iron shod wheels, with shafts and a pole

- 51 TROLLEY, built by Jack Winter of Hull, to suit 11 to 13 hh; the body painted red, with white lining, yellow scrolls and horse head on the tailboard, on white unders with lining and scroll decoration. On rubber tyres and to be sold with shafts, with a storage box to the rear
- 52 PHAETON, built circa 1901, to suit 14-2 to 16 hh; in unrestored condition and to be sold with shafts
- 53 WAGONETTE, German built circa 1900, to suit 14 to 15-2 hh, single or pair; in varnished natural wood with brown cord upholstery. On iron shod wheels, with seating for up to eight behind
- 54 PONY CART, built circa 1899, to suit 13 hh and over; in unrestored condition and in need of reassembling and painting. Originally built for and used by a Dr Tongue to carry out his rounds in the Beer & Seaton areas of Devon, then owned by a local farmer 1925 – 1930, and barn stored since 1950
- 55 GOVERNESS CAR to suit 14 hh and over; in two tone varnished natural wood with black lining and beige upholstery
- 56 DOG CART to suit 15 to 16 hh; in varnished natural wood with black and gold lining, and beige upholstery. A comfortable vehicle which has been placed many times
- 57 MARKET FLOAT, rebuilt by Alwyn Lee of Telford (a vintage car body builder) in 2005 in new ash using the pattern of an original vehicle by P Thomas & Son of Wrexham, the wheels renovated by Philip Holder of Wellington Carriages, Shropshire; painted light brown and in need of finishing. To suit a 14-2 hh cob, on iron shod wheels, elliptic springs and cranked axle and equipped with detachable livestock rails
- 58 BENT SIDED GIG by Robsons of Belfast circa 1901, fully renovated by Philip Holder four years ago, to suit 14-2 to 15 hh; painted black, with cream lining and buttoned black leather upholstery. A good pleasure driving / club vehicle on 53" 16- spoke warner wheels, which has not been used since being renovated. *The builder of this vehicle also built the Jaunting Car in the Coson Collection*
- 59 LONDON PANEL VAN to suit 13-2 to 14-2 hh; painted maroon with red scalloped edges. In good order, with leather seats and shafts
- 60 ROUND BACK GIG by Miller of London to suit up to 14-2 hh; painted green with gold lining and black upholstery. In very good order
- 61 BENNINGTON BUCCANEER to suit 15 to 16-2 hh; painted red, with dark metalwork lined red, and black vinyl seating. The balance is fully adjustable and the paintwork requires touching up; with brakes
- 62 FOUR-WHEELED DOG CART, the axle stamped Paris 1893 to suit approx. 15-2 hh, single or pair; recently totally refurbished and finished in navy blue with cream leather upholstery with navy studs. With a pole
- 63 SPINDLE BACK GIG, built by Champion of Chard circa 1984, to suit 14-2 to 15-2 hh; painted black with gold lining and a cream seat. On metal wheels and triple springs
- 64 PLEASURE DRIVING GIG, 25-30 years old, to suit 14-2 to 15-2 hh; painted black with a cream seat. On metal wheels with a back step and swingletree
- 65 JAUNTING CAR by Keane & Sons of Ennis circa 1900 to suit 14 to 15 hh; painted yellow with dark blue lining and blue upholstery. In good order following restoration by the owner between 2003 and 2006, the wheels being done by Rowlands of Colyton, after being brought over from Ireland in 1981
- 66 RALLI CAR by Squires & Sons of Bideford circa 1903 to suit 14 to 15 hh; disassembled for restoration, the body and iron shod wheels in need of attention, although the axle and springs have been cleaned and restored

- 67 DOG CART to suit 13 to 14 hh; painted dark brown with light brown and yellow lining, and beige wool cloth upholstery. In need of attention, with the potential to be used in country cart classes
- 68 GOVERNESS CAR, circa 1910, to suit 12 to 13 hh; painted dark red with white lining and blue vinyl cushions. On warner wheels and a cranked axle
