THE SALE WILL BE HELD under the usual Conditions of Sale, which are to be found at the end of this catalogue. In particular, descriptions made verbally or in this catalogue are not guaranteed, including sizes of harness and vehicles.

VIEWING ARRANGEMENTS: All lots will be on view up to and during the auction of the day of sale. Horse-drawn carriages must be in the Market prior to sale day, but most vendors prefer to bring their smaller items early in the morning of the auction. Tuesday is not officially a viewing day but prospective purchasers are welcome to inspect vehicles, although we cannot guarantee the time of their arrival.

BUYERS' NUMBERS: All prospective purchasers are requested to register with the Auctioneers prior to the sale when they will be given a **Buyer's Number** to enable bidding and assist the cashiering arrangements. The Auctioneers reserve the right to request a deposit of £500 from customers not known to them upon registration.

PAYMENT for all lots **must be made of the day of sale** and methods of payment are (1) CASH (2) CHEQUES supported by either a cheque guarantee card covering the sum or a letter of reference from your bank. Please note that cheques CANNOT be express cleared on the day of sale (3) BANKERS DRAFT (4) DIRECT DEBIT CARDS such as Switch, Delta or Connect with PIN number (5) CREDIT CARDS with PIN number, which are subject to a 2% premium surcharge. A BUYERS' PREMIUM of 7.5% (VAT inclusive at the standard rate) will be added to the purchase price of all lots at this sale.

VALUE ADDED TAX: All items consigned by VAT registered vendors are indicated by an asterisk (*), alongside the lot numbers, and VAT at the standard rate will be added to purchasers' accounts in respect of these lots. No VAT will be payable upon the items consigned by unregistered vendors. Any known variation in the VAT status of vendors will be announced by the Auctioneers when selling.

CLEARANCE: All lots should be cleared on the day of sale, unless alternative arrangements are made, and remain at the risk of the purchaser from the fall of the hammer.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BID will be executed with care and judgment by the Auctioneers. Clients who are interested in lots which are due to be offered in more than one section of the sale at the same time are reminded of this free service.

HORSE-DRAWN CARRIAGES

Lot

- 1 CAB FRONTED MARKET CART, believed to be over 100 years old, to suit 14-2 to 16 hh; finished in natural wood, on 16-spoke wheels, metal steps to rear and front. Purchased over 30 years ago and housed in a barn ever since, hence the need for some cosmetic renovation



- 2 HACKNEY SHOW WAGON, to suit 12 to 13 hh pony; painted black with black upholstery, on wire wheels with rubber treads, perch undercarriage with transverse spring at the rear and elliptic spring in the front. Spindle-sided seating with luggage compartment to the rear



- 3 SPINDLE BACK GIG, built by Brown & Son of Windsor in 1913, to suit 14 to 14-2 hh; painted black with red shafts and 50" Warner wheels on Dennet springs, gold lining and black leatherette upholstery, patent leather splash and mud guards. Successfully shown for many years with numerous wins and qualifiers in private driving and Concours de Elegance classes, including this season.



- 4 PONY BASKET PHAETON, to suit 11 to 12 hh pair or 13 hh single; painted black with willow basket seating, on 10 and 14-spoke wheels with elliptic springs, lamp brackets, handbrake, spares box, brass whipholder, rein rail, poles and shafts and two sets of cushions in beige and black vinyl. The vehicle was restored by Wellington Carriage Company four years ago. Successfully shown at county level.



5 SHOW PHAETON, to suit 12 to 13-2 hh pony, unicorn or team; finished in black and navy with yellow lining and button beige upholstery. The pretty, spindle-seated cut under body, with neat spares area behind the seat, is on elliptic springs and fitted with the quality features of carved dub ends, leather-covered seat rail and brake handle, and patent dash and splash boards. To county show standard, a consistent winner in the show ring with grey Welsh ponies, having competed at Horse of the Year Show twice. Refurbished some years ago by Fairbourne Carriages, this carriage has been carefully stored unused for the last five years, and is in excellent condition.



6 WAGONETTE, to suit 15 hh; painted dark blue with wicker work panelling, gold lining to shafts, wheels and body, black upholstery, on 12 and 14-spoke Warner wheels. In smart condition and has been used for weddings



7 DOG CART, built by Mulliver of Birmingham, circa 1901, to suit 14-2 to 15 hh; painted black and red. In need of restoration

8 PHOENIX WHISKEY GIG, built by Broadbent of Devon, to suit 13 to 14 hh; painted dark green with yellow lining to the wheels and shafts, black leather upholstery, on 16-spoke English pattern wheels with Dennet springs and brass hub caps. Repair has been carried out to front support strut. This carriage has won many championships with Parvadean Lotta Bottle in 2003/4



9 PENNSYLVANIA DOCTOR'S BUGGY, built by Carver of Pennsylvania, USA, circa 1900, to suit 15hh; painted in dark maroon and black with cream lining, with black button-backed upholstery, on 16-spoke wheels with a central perch and transverse springs, spindle-sided luggage compartment to the rear, shafts and metal steps. Has been in the UK for approximately 40-50 years



- 10 PRINCESS CART, a Studebaker style vehicle to suit 13 to 14 hh; finished in natural varnished wood with spindle sides and tan leather upholstery. On 14-spoke Warner wheels and elliptic springs lined in yellow with brass hub caps. A collector's item purchased at T&S in 2004, a very attractive vehicle in show condition



- 11 BELLCROWN SUPERBANTAM, built by Bellcrown of Malpas, circa 2004, to suit 14 to 15 hh; painted black with yellow 88cm, 12-spoke wheels with brass hub caps and upholstered in black vinyl, a wicker basket is housed below seat



- 12 DINERTH HALL PICKERING FLOAT, built by Lawton, circa 18th/19thc, to suit 13 to 14 hh; painted yellow and brown with wicker panels and upholstered in tan leather. On 16-spoke Warner wheels with cranked axle and Dennet springs, brass hub caps, rein rail and fittings with 'Dinerth Hall' painted in yellow beneath rail and rear door with metal step. Fully re-built and restored by Barry Wheelwright in 2003/4, in show condition but never shown



- 13 HEARSE, believed to be by John Marston of Birmingham, to suit 15 hh and over, single or pair; finished in black with ornately carved corner columns to the beveled glazed body, surmounted by filigree and star motifs. The unusual skeleton type front is mounted with carved heads to the sides and is on elliptic springs and Warner wheels, with a bowed splinter bar and handbrake, and the rear section is on triple springs. The interior is fitted with brass rails, stoppers and rollers, with a rolled fringed blind to the rear door. In an unrestored condition, needs repainting



- 14 GLASS FRONTED LANDAU, built by Hartland, to suit 15 to 17-3 hh; finished in blue and yellow paintwork with blue velvet and leatherette upholstery, on 12 and 14-spoke wheels, in need of some cosmetic repainting.



- 15 ICE CREAM CART, circa 1925, to suit 14 to 15 hh; body painted white on 14-spoke wheels, with 'Rossi's' painted around the canopy and 'Pure Ice Cream estd. 1912' and 'Award Winning Ice Creams' painted in blue on the sides, barley twist supports to the canopy, metal lamp brackets and rein rail



- 16 CHILD'S GYPSY CARAVAN, to suit 12 to 13-2 hh pony; painted red and yellow on new pneumatic tyres, in sound condition

- 17 BOW TOP GYPSY WAGON, built in Hartlepool, circa 1950, to suit 15 to 16 hh, painted green with cream and red lining, fruit, flower and scroll designs in gold and cream, and a yellow undercarriage lined in red. Rear decorated pan box and hay rade, with small stained and leaded window above and a glazed front door with brass furnishings. The interior is finished in natural varnished wood with bunches of grapes and leaves decorated in gold and green on the ceiling, drawers and on the cupboards beneath the bed. Turn screw brake, lamp brackets, a pair of steps and shafts. An original vehicle which has been in the same family since 1952, in sound condition though would benefit from some repainting



- 18 OPEN LOT GYPSY WAGON, decorated by John Pickett, finished in dark red and decorated with cream, green and gold scrolling, with a 70 year old undercarriage painted cream on iron treads and a green canvas roof with chimney. There is a pan box with doors inscribed 'J.R.', a hay rade and glazed rear windows. The interior is in natural varnished wood with decorated scrolling in the same colours, a bed with glazed cupboards beneath, storage cupboards and drawers and an original Queenie stove. Comes with steps, shafts and stand. In excellent condition and ready for the road



- 19 THREE-QUARTER SIZE BOW TOP CARAVAN, to suit 13 to 14 hh; pretty interior fitted with small bed and cupboards with cushioned bench seats. Craftsman made and professionally hand-painted and lined to the traditional design, a new wagon built on a London Trolley



- 20 GOVERNESS CAR, built by Williams of Cardiff, to suit 14 to 15 hh plus for single or tandem; painted black with gold lining, brown buttoned leather upholstery, 14-spoke Warner wheels on elliptic springs with brass hub caps stamped 'Williams, Cardiff', lamp brackets, mud guards, brass rein rail and 'TRF' monogrammed in gold on the rear door. Requires some attention to rear door, paintwork and wheel hub



- 21 GOVERNESS CAR, built by O'Gorman Bros. of Clonmel, to suit 12-2 to 13-2 hh pony; painted navy with blue lining and black upholstery, unrestored



- 22 DRESSAGE PHAETON, built by Renee Schoop, circa 2003, to suit 13 to 14 hh; painted navy blue with whitmetal fittings and black upholstery, lamp brackets, hand and foot brake. Suitable for HDT presentation, weighing approx. 165kgs. Inter-changeable brass fittings are available separately, **Lot 275**

- 23 TRAP, built by Notty Ash Carriage Company, to suit 13 hh approx; finished in green with gold lining, spindle-sided seating with green upholstery, on 10-spoke wheels with brass hubs, brass whipholder and rein rail



24 ICE CREAM CART, to suit 13 to 14 hh pony; painted red on wire spoked wheels with pneumatic tyres, shafts, lamp brackets and rein rail

25 INVALID CARRIAGE, wicker body on a metal frame with wire wheels on rubber tyres. Wooden handle at the back and a front steering handle. Measurements: 5'8 length, 3'2 height, 2'5 width



26 CHARABANC, built by Deason of Windermere, to suit a pair of horses; finished in black with red undercarriage and black leather upholstery, handbrake and whipholder. In an unrestored condition



27 BAKER'S CART, in an unrestored condition with a white roof, blue body with windows and red undercarriage and shafts



28 WAGONETTE, built by Neil Swanson of Marlborough, circa 1990, to suit 13-2 to 14-2 hh single or 12-2 to 13-2 hh pairs; painted dark green and upholstered in beige Melton. Comes with a pair pole and a set of single shafts. In smart condition and beautifully engineered, this vehicle is lightweight and very comfortable to ride in. Has extending axles and brake.



- 29 TWO-WHEEL MARKET GARDENER'S CART, built by the Bristol Wagon Carriage Co., to suit up to 14-3 hh; finished in natural varnished wood with black upholstery, shafts, lamp brackets and rein rail



- 30 FRENCH STYLE VICTORIA, possibly Pennsylvania origin, circa 1910/20's, to suit 14-2 to 16-2 hh; finished in green and black, upholstered in deep buttoned back green cloth, pair of lamp brackets and a wicker rear basket and for many years used f as a popular wedding carriage. There is an additional page boy/bridesmaid removable seat



- 31 DRAY, built by Howards of Norwich, circa 1901, to suit a heavy horse of 15 hh upwards; painted blue with red undercarriage and wheels and shafts. Used as a Costermongers wagon at one time



- 32 CORONA FRUIT DRINKS DRAY, built in the 1920's, to suit 14 to 16 hh; finished in red, black and gold leaf with black lining, on foam-filled tyres, 'Four Large Bottles in Case' painted on the side in gold lettering. Only two left in the country and used previously for light trade, restored in 2009



- 33 FOUR-WHEEL TROLLEY, to suit Shetland pony; painted yellow and red; in need of repair

- 34 FLAT BED TROLLEY, to suit 12 to 13-2 hh pony; painted red. In sound condition



- 35 THREE-WHEEL HAND-DRAWN MILK CART, circa early 1900's; a metal framed structure finished in red and cream, with cream roof inscribed with 'Co-Operative' in red, three original wooden side panels (loose) inscribed with 'Dairy' and the front box with 'London Co-Operative Society' in cream. A pretty little vehicle



- 36 TWO-WHEEL MILK FLOAT, by BP Hillier, South Wraxall; painted cream and brown, on iron shod wheels, with handbrake. A sound vehicle just requiring a small amount of attention



- 37 FLAT BED, on pneumatic tyres, suitable as an exercise vehicle for heavy horses

- 38 CONTINENTAL PHAETON, in sound condition but requires renovating

- 39 GOVERNESS CAR, finished in natural varnished wood, on 14-spoke Warner wheels, cranked axle and elliptic springs, brown upholstery, rein rail and lamp brackets; in smart condition



- 40 TWO WHEEL MARKET CART, built by Charronage Machines Agricoles of Cotin Legrand-Luge, to suit 14 to 15 hh; unrestored in natural varnished wood. Plaque inscribed, Vve Villaines – SIS Lure Saethe Chesnier Guit



41 GOVERNESS CAR, on 14-spoke English pattern wheels, has been stored in a barn for 60 years

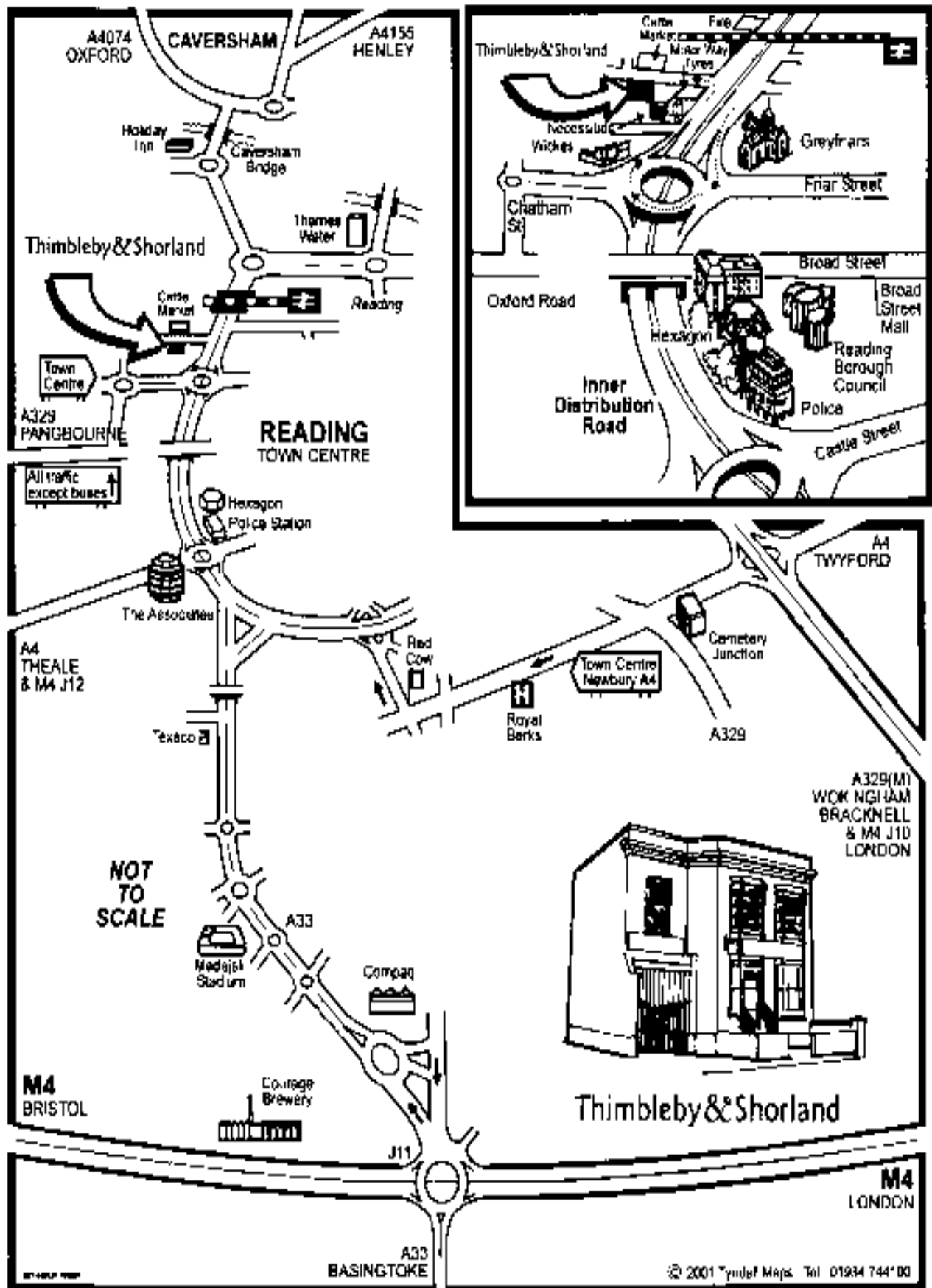
