**DIRECTIONS** The sale will be held on site at Paultons Park, Ower, Romsey, Hampshire SO51 6AL. Please refer to the map at the back of the catalogue and follow the brown tourist signs. Paultons is situated off junction 2 of the M27 and is signed from the motorway. Take the 3rd exit onto the A36, at the next roundabout take the 1st exit staying on the A36, turn right onto Romsey Road, then right and right again into the park.

**PARKING** There is parking on site for cars, trailers and lorries. Clients are reminded that they leave their vehicles at their own risk and the auctioneers and vendors are not responsible for any damage incurred while vehicles are parked on site. There will be STRICTLY no overnight parking for lorries or caravans.

**VIEWING** Viewing will be held on Tuesday 13th March from 10.00 am to 4.00 pm and on the morning of the sale from 8.00 am. There will be no viewing during the sale.
