### **CARRIAGES**

- 55 BURTON UPRIGHT SHOWMAN'S WAGON in fairly good condition
- 56 RALLI CAR to suit 14.3 to 15.2hh; a show condition vehicle painted green on 16-spoke wheels. With lancewood shafts and a pair of shaft sleeves
- 57 MARATHON VEHICLE to suit 15.2 to 16.2hh; painted maroon with delayed steering and disc brakes. In good working order
- 58 RALLI CAR circa 1800 to suit 15hh Welsh cob and a 15.2hh Hackney; a very smart vehicle painted lack with yellow lines. On 16-spoke Warner wheels which are 121.92cms high with Dennet springs. The shafts measure 60.96cms wide and 182.88cms long. Fitted with adjustable balance seat, lockable rear compartment, brass foot rest, whip holder and rein rail. In very good condition, with success in the show ring
- 59 TWO-WHEEL EXERCISE CART to suit a pony
- 60 TWO-WHEEL GIG to suit up to 17hh; painted black with brass fittings. On 58ins wheels with Dennet springs, rear metal step, and black upholstery. Photo shows with a 17hh Gelderland
- 61 LONDON TROLLEY to suit 14.2 to 15 hh; painted in maroon with decorations of gold and red scrolling, vine leaves, grapes and birds, and a Shire's head on the rear, drop-down tail board. A cream undercarriage on pneumatic wheels, and elliptic springs. Chrome fittings. Fitted with a foot brake, and shafts
- 62 WATERFORD CART painted dark red with green/red and blue decorations, and panels of painted lattice work, flowers and chickens. On pale yellow undercarriage with semi-elliptic springs and iron shod wheels. The flat bed is of painted cobs
